



Virtual Learning FAQ's

“How long will NBCA operate fully virtual? What factors will be considered to return to in-person instruction?”

Students will learn at home virtually until further notice, but we remain determined to return stronger to in-person learning this school year. We will continue to rely on local science and guidance from the Kent County Health Department in our decision-making to keep educators and students safe.

“Does my child need to have a Learning Coach?”

Yes, your child must have a responsible adult or older child who can help a younger child navigate websites, answer questions, and encourage positive learning behavior during Zoom calls.

“How will attendance be taken during virtual learning?”

Attendance policies and expectations will remain the same for the 2020-21 school year. However, for virtual classes, the method for taking attendance will be done by teachers during Zoom calls that are held in the AM (before 12 noon) and PM (after 12 noon). Students must be present for all Zoom calls in their entirety in order to be marked present. If students are not present during the whole Zoom call, they are considered absent.

“Does NBCA have a plan to support English language learners?”

English learners will continue to receive all necessary instructional support virtually.

“Will teachers be teaching virtually at home or at the school building?”

All teachers will have an option to teach remotely or in the school building based on their preference and need.

Does NBCA have a plan to support students with disabilities or special needs (IEPs, 504)?

Virtual educational options will be developed by each student's respective IEP team.
